Opening the concert will be a world premiere LPO commission of a new work by Latin Grammy-nominated composer Juan Pablo Contreras followed by Hungarian folk elements coming to life through the orchestra in Kodaly's *Dances of Galánta*.

Living Peruvian American composer, Gabriela Lena Frank marries the composer's Peruvian culture and the British composer Benjamin Britten in the opening *Concertino Cusqueño*.



The best of Ravel will be on display with the rarely performed *Daphnis et Chloe* suite along with his *Piano Concerto for the Left Hand*, played brilliantly by frequent LPO collaborator Jorge Federico Osorio. The orchestra will build for the finale as Ravel's *Boléro* brings everyone together.

PARKS CONCERTS

YOUNG PEOPLE'S CONCERTS

The Bob and Jeri Nims Young People's Concerts target 2nd through 8th grade students. In these field trip concerts, the LPO partners with Carnegie Hall's Link Up program, which offers students the opportunity to sing or play along with the LPO on recorders or string instruments.


